This trail is the eastern end of Valley Loop Trail. You may want to backtrack when you reach the lake to shorten your trip.</p>	<p>Morning drive to Glacier Point. Get an early start and be the first family of the day to see the views of Yosemite Valley. Don't forget to bring a picnic.</p> <p>Relax and enjoy the rocks!</p>	<p>Consider lunch on the patio at the "Majestic Hotel" (former Ahwahnee Hotel). There's a grassy area where kids can romp and chase birds, while you're waiting for your meal.</p> <p>Check out the hotel and candy shop!</p>	<p>Consider lunch at the Big Trees Hotel (former Wawona Hotel).</p> <p>Visit the Pioneer History Center.</p> <p>Mariposa Grove is also a must-see in this area, but it's closed until summer 2017.</p>	<p>Visit Happy Isles Nature Center after your hike. Learn about native trees and Yosemite wildlife.</p> <p>Go on a tree hunt to see how many trees you can identify.</p>
